- Segment 1 of CO 45 has a higher than desired density of access points
 - 10 access points per mile is a good level in urban areas (Source: TRB)
 - 20 access points per mile can increase crash rates by 40%
 - For each access point over this the crash rates can increase by as much as 4%
- Most access points allow full movement which increases conflict points
- Existing number and type of access locations results in higher crash potential

- Crashes on CO 45 are higher than average compared to similar highways across the state
- Access control can reduce the potential for crashes, including most severe types
- Unchecked future access points can further increase crash potential
- An access control plan can provide benefit to the safety of CO 45 users

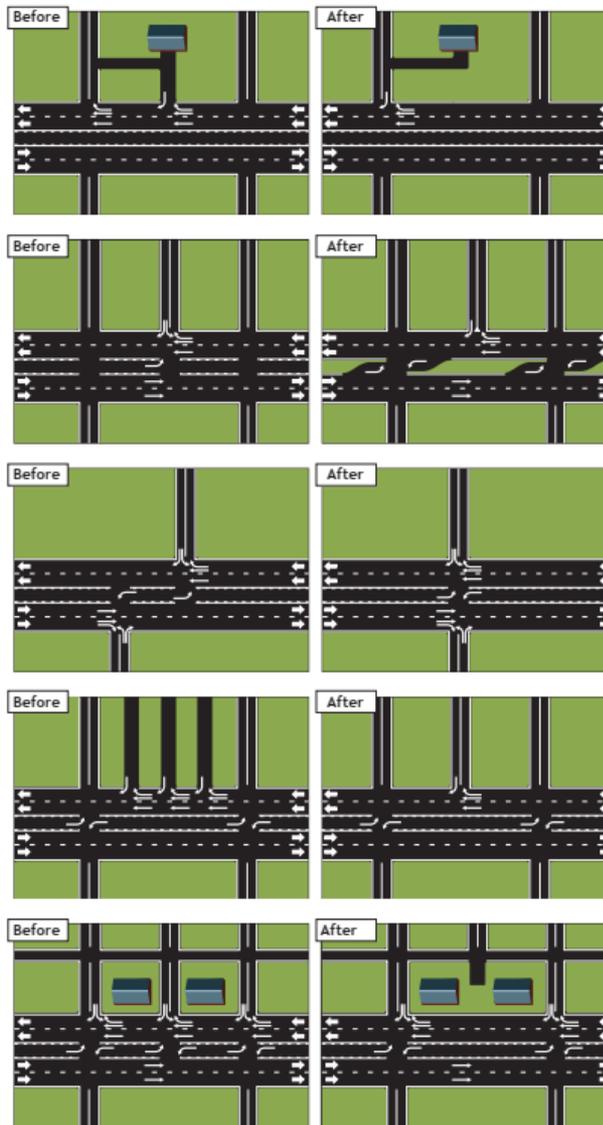


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Options to Optimize Existing and Future Access



Use Local Streets

- Access to local properties through secondary roads
- Consolidate number of access locations where vehicles may enter or exit the highway
- Reduces the number of conflict points

Addition of Median Treatment

- Limit turning movements to locations with a dedicated left turn lane
- Reduces the number of conflicts between left turning vehicles and through vehicles on the highway

Realignment

- Align opposite approaches
- Creates a more familiar intersection design

Consolidation

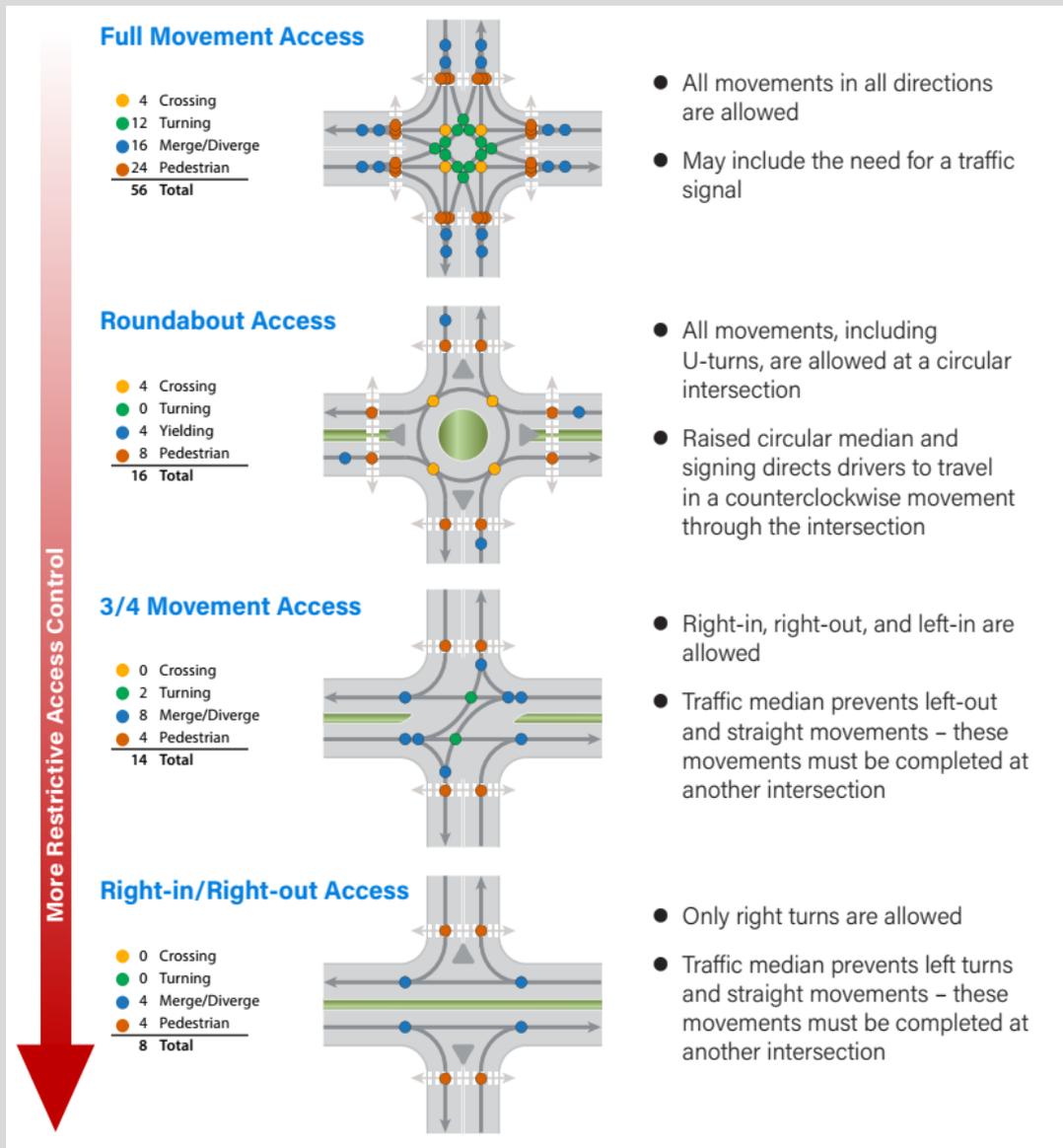
- Consolidate adjacent access points into fewer locations
- The number of conflict points are reduced

Alternate Access Route

- Provide access to properties via an improved/new alternate access road
- Reduces the number of access points along the highway

- Monthly project team meetings
- Conducted an in person and virtual public meeting
 - January 2022-presented draft plan and received input from public

What the Final Plan Will Do

- Create a long term (2045 and beyond) plan for CO 45 access
- Optimize the location, number, and type of access points
- Help reduce crash potential
- Support the long-term plans for development/redevelopment
- Provide the appropriate level of access to adjacent properties
- Meet the requirements of the State Highway Access Code
- Address concerns raised by stakeholders
- Outline the conditions that must be satisfied before a change in access will occur



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The Final Plan Does Not

- Identify specific projects
- Establish a timeline for when changes will occur
- Include design details (such as turnlanes) of potential access, mobility, safety, or capacity improvements within the project limits (done as part of future projects/studies)
- Preclude current projects planned for CO 45
- Prohibit future amendments to the final recommendations
- Preclude future development or redevelopment



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Next Steps

- Finalize the plan
- Adopt/Execute an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between County, City, and CDOT
- On-going future coordination between the County, City, and CDOT to ensure proper implementation of the plan
- Amend the plan as needed



Implementation of the Plan

- Phased approach (will not occur as a single project)
 - Currently, there is no identified state or federal funding to implement any or all of the improvements
- Triggers for implementation include:
 - Part of the development or redevelopment process
 - Traffic operational issues
 - An identified safety concern
 - As a result of a roadway improvement project



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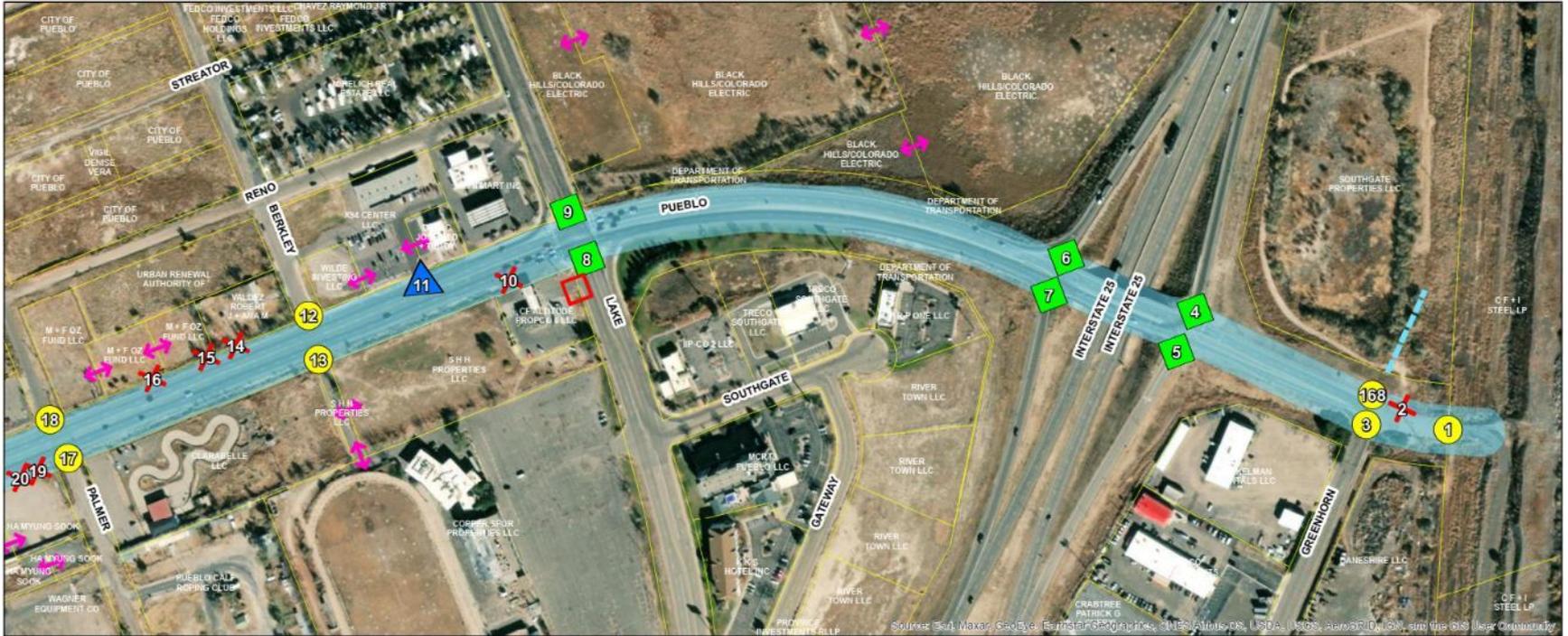

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CO-45 Recommended Access Conditions



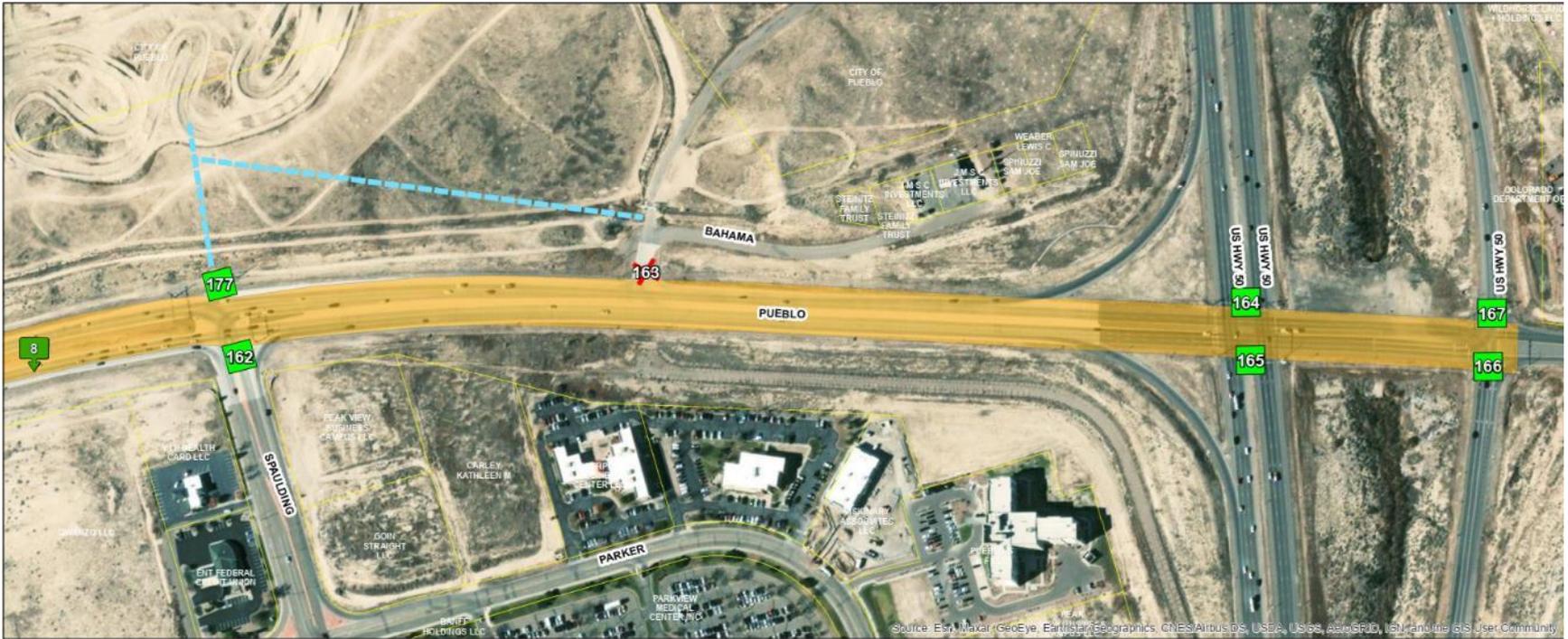
