

**PUEBLO LIQUOR & BEER LICENSING BOARD**

The Pueblo Liquor & Beer Licensing Board convened the Special Meeting of May 27, 2015 at 9:00 a.m., with Chairwoman Doris Harrison presiding.

**ROLL CALL**

**REGULAR AGENDA**

**1 ALLEGED LIQUOR CODE VIOLATIONS-TAVERN LIQUOR LICENSE-CHRISTOPHER RODRIGUEZ D/B/A SHARKY'S BAR, 1549 E. EVANS AVENUE (POLICE CR#'S: 14-16034, 14-23078, 15-2140 AND 15-4193) CONTINUED FROM MARCH 4, 2015 AND MAY 6, 2015**

Owner Christopher Rodriguez, 102 W. Pitkin, was sworn in and Tony Perko, Counsel for Mr. Rodriguez d/b/a Sharky's Bar appeared before the Board. Assistant City Attorney and Conflicts Counsel, Carla Sikes was present on behalf of the Pueblo Police Department.

Assistant City Attorney, Carla Sikes stated that a Stipulated Findings and Order had been reached for the matter and read the document into the record. The Board asked for clarification on some of the language in the Stipulated Findings and Order.

Mr. DiFatta asked the arguments in reaching the Stipulated Findings and Order agreement for each side be heard. Counsel Perko stated for record that the Licensee is voluntarily surrendering the license and was fully cooperative with the investigation. Ms. Sikes stated this disturbance took place over a multitude of hours and at no time was the Police notified of the disturbance or medical attention asked for.

Mr. DiFatta moved seconded by Mr. Ferris to accept the Stipulated Findings and Order as read. Roll Call: Ayes—Ferris, Harrison and Pullaro. Nays: DiFatta and Rose. Motion carried 3-2.


**2 TAVERN LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATIONS-RENEWAL - CHRISTOPHER RODRIGUEZ D/B/A SHARKY'S BAR, 1549 E. EVANS AVENUE**
