7 SPECIAL EVENTS PERMIT APPLICATION – BEER, WINE, AND SPIRITUOUS LIQUOR LICENSE – THE MCCLELLAND CHILDREN’S FOUNDATION D/B/A THE MCCLELLAND SCHOOL, 415 E. ABRIENDO AVENUE, EVENT MANAGER JO NESBIT (EVENT TO BE HELD MAY 4, 2019. ADDRESS OF EVENT: 415 E. ABRIENDO AVENUE)

Head of School and Event Manager Jo Nesbit, 4745 Eagleridge Circle, Pueblo, CO was sworn in and answered questions from the Board. This fundraiser will benefit The McClelland School. There will be one liquor distribution point with two servers. Classic Catering will cater the event. Approved forms of identification were explained and examples given. This is an adult only event; however, wristbands will be utilized for bar patrons. There is one entry/exit point into the event and staff will be assigned to provide security and maintain order. A fence secures the premises.

Ms. Montgomery, seconded by Ms. Sowinski, moved to approve the special events permit application for The McClelland Children’s Foundation d/b/a The McClelland School. Roll Call: Ayes — Montgomery, Pullaro, Shafer, and Sowinski. Motion carried 4-0.

8 HEARING: LODGING AND ENTERTAINMENT LIQUOR LICENSE – CINEMARK USA, INC. D/B/A CINEMARK TINSELTON 14 PUEBLO, 4140 NORTH FREEWAY ROAD

For the record, it was determined there was no one present in opposition to the issuance of this license.

Attorney Brian Proffitt, #31101, Runco & Proffitt, P.C., 1616 17th Street, Suite 376, Denver, CO entered his appearance on behalf of the applicant. Max Scott, Oedipus, P.O. Box 1012, Lafayette, CO and Wendy Maldonado, General Manager, Cinemark Tinseltown 14 Pueblo, 4307 Wilderness Trail, Pueblo, CO were sworn in and answered questions from the Board. Tinseltown has 65 employees including 11 managers. Staff wearing a yellow lanyard will be authorized to serve liquor. In addition to the 11 managers, there are 10 to 15 staff that will also serve. Servers have attended ServSafe training as well as internal Cinemark training. Approved forms of identification were described and examples given. All persons wishing to purchase liquor will have their identification checked and scanned. One security guard will be on-site except on Mondays and Wednesdays. Tinseltown intends to serve liquor and beer in clear plastic containers with a drink limit of two drinks per customer per visit. Drink options include six beers on tap plus approximately 12 bottled options, wine by the glass, and two frozen margarita/dacquari and rum and Coke options.



Mr. Tony Pullaro, seconded by Ms. Sowinski, moved to continue this item to the May 1, 2019 Regular Meeting to allow the Board time to further verify petition signatures. Roll Call: Ayes — Montgomery, Pullaro, Shafer, and Sowinski. Motion carried 4-0.
