



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). The SBC shows you how you and the [plan](#) would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about how the cost of this [plan](#) (called the [premium](#)) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	\$2,000/single or \$3,500/family for In-Network Providers . \$3,500/single or \$7,000/family for Out-of-Network Providers .	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan , the overall family deductible must be met before the plan begins to pay.
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Preventive care for In-Network Providers .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services with cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible . See a list of covered preventive services at https://www.healthcare.gov/coverage/preventive-care-benefits/ .
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	\$2,000/single or \$3,500/family for In-Network Providers . \$6,500/single or \$13,000/family for Out-of-Network Providers .	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , balance-billed charges and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if you use a network provider ?	Yes. PPO. See www.anthem.com or call (866) 837-4596 for a list of network providers .	This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network . You will pay the most if you use an out-of- network provider and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware your network provider might use an out-of- network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.
Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	No.	You can see the specialist you choose without a referral .
