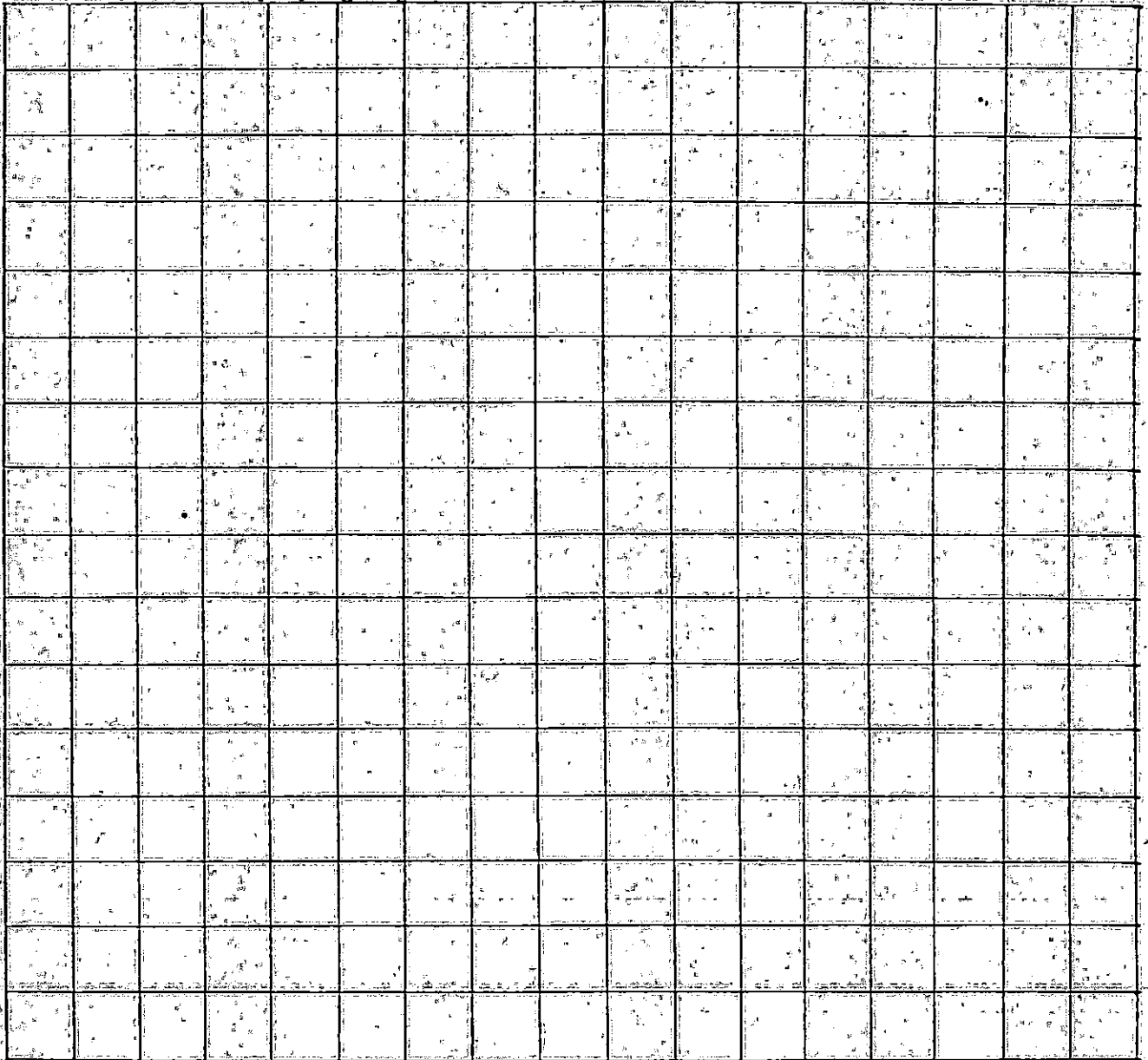

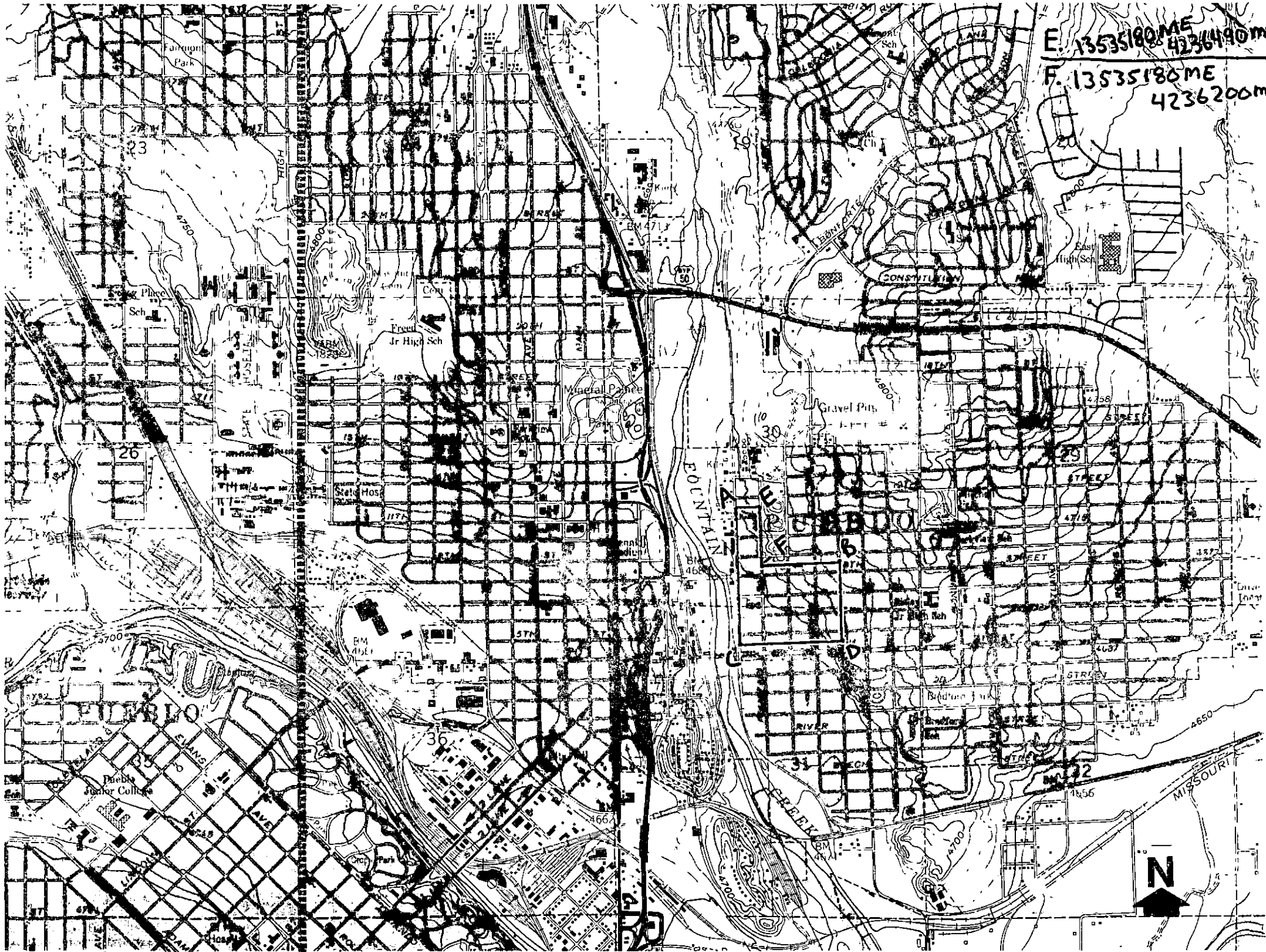
V. REFERENCES:

FOUNTAIN--RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

The Fountain District is roughly bounded by Fountain Street on the west, the alleys between 11th and 12th Streets and 9th and 10th Streets on the north, Joplin Street on the east, and the alley between 4th and 5th Streets on the south. This district is a portion of the East Pueblo Subdivision. The plat for this subdivision was recorded in 1872. The Fountain Creek District, as with the other east Pueblo districts, exhibits a wide period of development. Within this district both Victorian and Bungalow style structures can be found. This district is differentiated from the other districts in that it contains a higher concentration of 1890-1900 vintage structures than the others. These are predominantly brick structures. Many of these structures appear to be tract houses. Many of these structures are similar to those found in the Lower East Side District and the Bessemer District. Portions of this area were first mapped by the Sanborn Insurance Company in 1893 and 1904.
