LAKE AVENUE--RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

The Lake Avenue District is generally bounded by West Northern on the north, Jones on the south, the Bessemer Ditch on the east, and the alley between Lake and Carteret on the west. The major subdivision within this district is Lake Avenue Addition. This subdivision was recorded in 1901. This district is characterized by a mixture of 1900 two-story brick structures and 1920-1930 vintage Bungalows. Some of the best examples of Bungalow architecture in Pueblo can be found within this district, along Lake Avenue. This area was mapped by the Sanborn Insurance Company in 1905.
